## discussion questions

- 1. The title of this novel is *Liberty*. How does that fit with the story?
- 2. This story alternates between different characters and points of view. Did one story speak to you more than another? Do you identify with one character more than another?
- 3. How does guilt affect the actions of characters in the novel? How does love? How does fear?
- 4. What is the central theme in this story? How do other themes support the main theme?
- 5. What are Carrie's strengths and weaknesses? How did they help or hinder her throughout the novel? What about Greg's?
- 6. Greg convinces himself to stay away from Carrie for 'her own safety.' Do you think his actions were justified?
- 7. Do you think Carrie should have gone out with Oliver?
- 8. Do you agree with Mariah's advice to *Worry less and love more?* What about to *Fight for happiness?*
- 9. In this novel, Oliver and Greg are asked to do things that go against their moral judgment, but they do it anyway to save someone they love. Do you agree with their actions? Would you have done differently?
- 10. Do you think the clan should join the rebellion?
- 11. The rebels started quoting John Stark, a Revolutionary War general. *Live free or die. There are things far worse than death?* How do you feel about this sentiment?
- 12. Did this book end the way you expected?
- 13. Did this book affect your view on your own liberties?'
