David Solomon is an internationally renowned scholar and speaker across many and varied disciplines. He is acknowledged as one of the most dynamic Jewish educators in the world today, presenting lectures and courses around the globe on topics including Modern and Biblical Hebrew, Tanakh, Kabbalah, Jewish History, Anthropology of Religion and Conceptual Art.

David holds University degrees in Anthropology, English Literature, Jewish Studies and Media Broadcasting. Before attending University, David spent five years learning in yeshivot in both Israel and Australia, and studied with several influential teachers, particularly in the realm of Kabbalah.

In 1996, following a varied academic and artistic career, David moved from Australia to University College in London as a researcher and tutor. He later coordinated and conducted courses in Hebrew and Jewish culture for diplomats and translators attached to the British Government.

On his return to Australia in 2004, David co-founded the College of Jewish Studies, which aimed to develop invigorating talks on key Jewish topics and on adult education. This initiative led to the establishment in 2006 of the hugely successful "In one hour" lecture series, each of which serves as an introduction to a major topic of Jewish studies. David inspires and enthuses his audiences to research and explore these topics through his innovative teaching style of combining traditional sources with original visual mapping techniques, and then presenting them in an engaging style.

David continues to work as a scholar, at the forefront of research in Jewish Studies. In 2012, David was commissioned by Neshama Life to undertake the first-ever translation of the fundamental Kabbalistic text, *Tiqunei HaZohar*. David is based in Sydney, Australia.

PRESENTATION SYNOPSES

Chazal In the Age of Empires: An Overview of the Talmudic Period

When we think of the first five hundred years of the Common Era (0-500 BCE) in Jewish History, we are often focused on the destruction of the Temple and the clash between the Jewish People and Rome. But this period was also one of tremendous activity for the great sages of Israel who were shaping the Jewish world, learning to adjust to its new reality of exile. This three part series examines the extraordinary figures and events of First Century Palestine while placing them in the broader

context of the revolution which was taking place in Jewish life, and the work to preserve the continuity of the Jewish people.

Elijah the Prophet: Past, Present and Future

The mysterious and enigmatic figure of Elijah features greatly in Jewish tradition, although the descriptions of his career in the Bible do not always sit comfortably with other legends or the role of Elijah in the coming Redemption. David Solomon will explore and reconcile the various perceptions of Elijah, and may even point the

way towards his revelation (the haphtarah of this Shabbat concerns Elijah).

Great Daughters of Zion– Extraordinary Women of the Bible

While most of the leading figures in the Bible are men, there are, scattered throughout Tanach, examples of remarkable women whose characters and actions were of great importance. David draws on sources in the Aggadah and the Mishnah to shed light on some of these amazing women and their incredible stories.

Has the Mashiach Already Come? Famous Historical Disputations Between Jews and Christians—and Their Outcomes

Throughout the Middle Ages and beyond, Jewish communities were often forced to participate in debates with Christians. Often, these “disputations” were a matter of life and death for the communities involved. These events were not merely arguments over ideas, but clashes of amazing personalities. David explores the real story behind famous disputations, the characters involved and the impact these debates had on the Jewish world, right up to today.

How to Build a Jewish Library

David literally constructs an essential Jewish library for an audience. In doing so, he shows the relationship of texts to each other, the various categories of books and how an impressive library of important Jewish texts can be built up from basic elements. He even tells you what editions are worth buying and where to get them.

Ignore, Argue Or Teach: What To Say To Christians At Your Front Door

Reaching into the heart of Jewish-Christian polemic, this talk aims to enlighten audiences on the most effective ways to deal with Christian missionaries. In doing so, it also analyses the two scriptural texts most quoted by Christian missionaries.

The Jewish Future In One Hour

David unveils the opinions of significant Jewish historical figures on what is expected to happen during the Messianic era. Bringing together a broad range of sources, David presents the most commonly accepted ideas of the sages about this long-anticipated period, while allowing some of the more marginal—and often controversial opinions—to join the fray. The talk provides an overview of a complex and sometimes challenging topic—and one which is not for the faint-hearted! David examines what to expect from the dawn to the close of the Messianic period, exploring ideas such as the Garden of Eden, the resurrection of the dead, Gog and Magog, the new Torah and the coming of the Mashiach.

The Jewish Nation & the Rise of the Modern World—the Last 500 Years of Jewish History

The period of the Acharonim (the latter ones) sees the Jewish world as we know it today emerging into focus. Scattered with an array of hugely influential figures and movements, this period reveals the emergence of the modern streams of Jewish existence such as Orthodox and Reform Judaism, Chassidism, and the Jewish Enlightenment (the Haskalah). It also brings us the idea of the emancipated Jew, sees the rise of Zionism, mass migrations of world Jewry, the horrors of the Holocaust, the State of Israel and much, much more...
